New Season for REdi

With the **Realizing Robertson's Future** campaign coming to an end in June, much study and discussion has taken place about the future of **REdi**, how it will be funded and which programs are most beneficial and worthy of continuing. First you would take a simple blood test to see if you are a match. If you are blood type A or O, between 18 and 59 years old, and in basic good health, chances are you could be the one to save Jim's life.
